## Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course, participants will:

- Be equipped with skills and knowledge to identify threats to personal safety and security and mitigate the risks.

## Course Contents

The curriculum is based on the Safe and Secure Approaches in Field Environments (SSAFE) standard modules: UN Security Management System; History, Background and Culture; Personal Security; Radio Communications; Weapon Awareness; Travel, Convoy and Vehicle Security; Hostage Survival; Incident Management (Basic Life-saving); and Field-based Exercise/Simulations

## Course Methodology

This course combines theoretical lessons, demonstrations, group work, practical exercises and simulations. It is delivered by SSAFE certified Trainers who regularly run SSAFE courses in their duty stations. A unique feature is the field-day exercise, conducted with professional role players from the Italian Army, which simulates real situations that staff may encounter while fulfilling their duties and missions.
