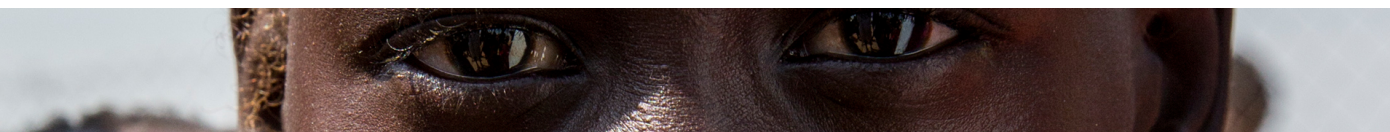




Conflict Analysis for Prevention and Peacebuilding

Introduction

Conflict analysis is a key aspect of conflict prevention and peacebuilding work. It provides objective criteria for setting priorities, and contributes to the evaluation of the impact of preventive and peace consolidation programmes. At the same time, conflict analysis is the basis for any peace-making intervention, since good conflict assessments help peace mediators best address the needs and interests of the diverse stakeholders involved in a conflict.

Objectives

The learning objectives of the course are:

- To study and practice conflict analysis tools to better understand the context in which we operate and address the key drivers of instability and insecurity in turbulent regions, crisis countries and post-conflict settings;
- To provide a conceptual understanding of both theoretical and operational aspects of conflict prevention and peacebuilding;
- To learn about prioritisation and entry points for prevention and peacebuilding programming.

Course Contents

- Self-paced online modules on conflict analysis tools
- Tutoring support by a professional conflict analyst during the entire course
- Quizzes and written assignments
- Webinars by UN experts on: peacebuilding programming, gender-sensitive conflict analysis, use of analysis in peace operations, conflict-sensitive humanitarian and development assistance
- Interactive forum for participants' discussions and exchange

Course Methodology

This individual self-paced online course is delivered in English and is built on a range of readings, self-study exercises, a discussion forum, as well as feedback from a tutor. The course is delivered entirely online in asynchronous mode and the format does not allow for live interaction among participants. No special software is required; participants only need internet connection and headset to listen to the voice over.

Delivered in English, it is developed around a blended formula whereby participants are required to advance and complete different topics and sessions.

Certificate of completion: In order to receive a certificate of course completion participants will have to:

- Take all 12 lectures and complete the related quizzes
- Participate in the interactive forum
- Submit and pass two written conflict analysis assignments reviewed by the tutor

Although it's not a requirement, participation in the live webinars once a week is strongly recommended.

Average workload: 15-20 hours (this estimate is based on an average of past courses)

Target Audience

UN professional staff and partners working in contexts of deteriorating human security, armed conflict, political crisis and other threats to peace. Open also to non-UN staff.

Cost of participation

Course fees USD 1000 which includes inter-action with a tutor through webinars as well as individual feedback from the tutor on the final assignment.
