Terms of Reference

Under the supervision of the relevant UNSSC Learning Portfolio Manager, and within delegated authority, the Associate Fellow will be responsible for the following duties:

- Contribute to the design, development, and delivery of learning courses on data and data analytics for peace and security professionals;
- Deliver webinars on various aspects of data analytics, including data collection, data cleaning, data governance, visualization and storytelling, predictive analysis, and Generative AI;
- Engage with UN participants, addressing their inquiries and guiding them through learning activities;
- Provide support to resource persons and subject matter experts ensuring a cohesive approach and alignment with the course curricula;
- Conduct research to identify relevant data management, visualization and GenAI tools, materials, examples, and data sets for use in learning sessions;
- Keep abreast of UN policy developments regarding UN 2.0, Quintet of Change and data analytics, especially in relation to the peace and security pillar;
- Any other duties as required.

Qualifications required

Education: Advanced university degree (Master's degree or equivalent) in computer science, data science, analytics, statistics, or a related quantitative field. A first-level university degree in combination with qualifying experience may be accepted in lieu of the advanced university degree.

Experience: a minimum of 3 years of progressively responsible experience in applied analytics, business intelligence, information management, statistics or related area is required.

Proven experience with data visualization (e.g. Tableau or Power BI), and data collection, analysis and Generative AI software is required.

Experience with other programming languages (SQL, Python, R), Microsoft Power Apps, Microsoft Copilot Studio is an asset. Experience working in learning environments is an asset.

Experience in conflict prevention, peacekeeping, integrating AI in peacebuilding, digital peacebuilding, media monitoring, community building, media literacy, integrated analytics is highly desirable.

Experience in working with the UN is desirable.

Language: Fluency in oral and written English is required. Knowledge of a second UN language is an advantage.

Competencies

Professionalism: Excellent analytical skills with the ability to collect, organize, manage, and disseminate significant amounts of information with attention to detail and accuracy. The ability to analyse, model and interpret data in support of decision-making and convey information succinctly to management. Adept at queries, report writing and presenting findings. Ability to apply judgment in the context of assignments given, plan own work and manage conflicting priorities.

Client Orientation: Considers all those to whom services are provided to be “clients” and seeks to see things from clients’ point of view; establishes and maintains productive partnerships with clients by gaining their trust and respect; identifies clients’ needs and matches them to appropriate solutions; monitors ongoing developments inside and outside the clients’ environment to keep informed and anticipate problems; keeps clients informed of progress or setbacks in projects; meets timeline for delivery of products or services to client.

Creativity: Actively seeks to improve processes and services; offers new and different options to solve problems or meet client needs; promotes and persuades others to consider new ideas; takes an interest in new ideas and new ways of doing things; is not bound by current thinking or traditional approaches.

Teamwork: Works collaboratively with colleagues to achieve organizational goals; solicits input by genuinely valuing others’ ideas and expertise; is willing to learn from others; places team agenda before personal agenda; supports and acts in accordance with final group decision, even when such decisions may not entirely reflect own position; shares credit for team accomplishments and accepts joint responsibility for team shortcomings.

Technological Awareness: Keeps abreast of available technology; understands applicability and limitation of technology to the work of the office; actively seeks to apply technology to appropriate tasks; shows willingness to learn new technology.
