Organizational Context:

The United Nations System Staff College (UNSSC) is dedicated to serving the learning and knowledge needs of the UN system and partner organizations. We create first-rate learning experiences grounded in the bedrock values of multilateralism and dignity for all enshrined in the UN charter. Participants in our programmes rely on UNSSC to enhance their knowledge and skills across leadership and management, sustainable development, and peace and security. UNSSC is headquartered in Turin, Italy with an office in Bonn, Germany.

The intern will work with the Analysis to Action Portfolio of the UNSSC's Peace and Security Hub. In this role, they will contribute to diverse Youth, Peace and Security projects, in particular supporting in the launch of the YPS Primer in Georgian, as part of an ongoing collaboration with UNDP Georgia.

Responsibilities:

Under the direct supervision of the Project Coordinator, the Intern will be responsible for, but not limited to, the following:

- Contribute to the overall development (using e-learning tools) and quality check of the Youth, Peace and Security Primer in Georgian
- Support with the outreach campaign of the above-mentioned primer, as well as other communication related tasks linked to youth-related learning initiatives (e.g. Report writing, drafting a blogpost);
- Assist in the development of training materials in Georgian, including the revision of existing resources;
- Support in the enrolment process and providing tech-support to participants in Georgian, by developing FAQs, which can be shared with future participants in need of technical assistance;
- Participate in coordination efforts within the portfolio and with the project partners;
- Assist the Team through research, policy scanning, and reviewing background papers on Youth, Peace and Security and other youth-related issues;
- Assist the portfolio team in various activities and perform other related duties as required.

Qualifications required:

Education:

Candidates currently enrolled in or having completed a University programme in international relations, security, peace and conflict studies, gender, education or an area related to UNSSC programmatic priorities.

Experience:

Previous work experience is not required. **Demonstrated interest in e-learning and/or issues related to Youth, Peace and Security is desirable.**

Language competencies:

Fluency (written and oral) in Georgian and a working capacity in English are required. Additionally, knowledge of any other UN-language is a strong merit.

Computer skills:

Knowledge of online learning and social media tools; proven ability to use Microsoft Office, internet browsers and online platforms is required. Knowledge of Articulate Rise and/or the Adobe suite is an asset.

Other skills and competencies:

Ability to learn and act in a fast-paced environment.

Ability to work effectively as part of a team.

High motivation, with a desire to learn and grow professionally.

Familiarity with online learning platforms and social media tools.

Submission of applications

Eligible candidates interested in doing an internship at the United Nations System Staff College must submit in English:

- An up-to-date curriculum vitae (resume);
- A motivation letter;
- For applicants who are currently enrolled in a degree programme, an endorsement from their University or higher education institution is required.

Other Information

Selection and commencement

Candidates for the Internship Programme are selected on a competitive basis. Only those candidates who meet the requirements of the position will be short-listed and interviewed. The candidates will be informed of the result of the selection process as soon as it is finalized.

Completion of the programme

At the end of the internship period, a written evaluation of the intern's performance will be prepared, and a meeting will be organized with the intern to provide feedback. Upon completion of the Internship programme the candidate will be provided with a certificate of attendance.

Financial aspects

The intern shall receive a stipend from UNSSC intended to assist in covering basic subsistence costs. The monthly amount of the stipend is fixed at **600€**. No other payment of any kind shall be made to an intern by UNSSC in connection with an internship agreement.

Further career opportunities

The intern shall not be considered in any respect as being a staff member of UNSSC and shall not accrue benefits. In this regard, assignments under the Internship Programme do not carry expectation of conversion to any other type of contract or appointment in any activity of the UNSSC. Interns may not apply for or be appointed to any position in the Professional or above

categories during the period of their internship and for the six months immediately following the expiration date thereof.
