















# STRENGTHENING ONLINE TRAINING CAPACITIES FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

## **OBJECTIVE**

To strengthen the capabilities of civil servants to support the implementation of the 2030Agenda for Sustainable Development as well as the imperative to Build Back Better in the context of Covid-19.

To this end, the **Training of Trainers (ToT)** will enhance the quality of online offerings of Schools of Public Administration.

## PROGRAMME DESIGN

The online Training of Trainers is a **two-and-half month** long interactive programme comprising four learning blocks, which consist of two virtual classroom sessions each.

The programme combines substantive sessions on Sustainable Development and Climate Change with interactive learning formats about online teaching, facilitation and presentation skills.

Through group projects, personal reflections, readings and sessions of practice, the programme is conceived as a hands-on learning experience for effective knowledge brokering.
